Asian Agri-History Foundation: **Progress Report 2014**

- 1. AAHF, which was established in 1994, completed 20 years of its activities in 2014. On 1 January 2014, YL Nene retired as Founder Chairman and SN Nigam took over as Chairman responding to the unanimous request of the Trustees. YL Nene continued his association with AAHF as Chairman Emeritus.
- 2. A new brochure on AAHF was prepared and is being circulated widely to promote the mission of AAHF and to enhance the corpus fund and journal subscription. During 2014, several individuals and two companies contributed to the corpus of the AAHF.
- 3. **OP Rupela**, former ICRISAT scientist, accepted the position of Honorary Public Relations Advisor replacing DM Pawar. We wish to put on records our appreciation to DM Pawar for his services rendered to the Foundation. KL Sahrawat, former ICRISAT scientist, accepted the position of Honorary Editor for Asian Agri-History journal.
- 4. Asian Agri-History journal:
- The number of subscribers to the journal in 2014 was 389 (Individuals 318; Institutions 71). Again we record our gratitude to KK Ranade, Director (Operations), IOT Engineers Pvt. Ltd., Mumbai for obtaining subscription of 100 persons.
- Thirty-three articles were published in Volume 18 of which 30 were from India

- and one each from Australia, Thailand, and USA. Two book reviews were also published.
- Twenty-one papers in the series on "Probable agricultural biodiversity heritage sites in India" by AK Singh were published in Asian Agri-History journal starting in 2009 (Volume 13) and concluding in 2014 (Volume 18).
- The historicity of Kalanamak, an aromatic rice variety, was quoted in Asian Agri-History journal Volume 9, No. 3 in 2005 in the article "Rediscovering scented rice cultivar Kalanamak" by US Singh and coauthors. This information was useful as Kalanamak was awarded the Geographical Indication (GI) tag in September 2013 for its geographical status in Uttar Pradesh. Kalanamak grain has black husk and a mild salty taste. Known for its aroma and distinct taste, it is considered as one of the finest rice varieties in the international market. The article "GI tag awarded to Kalanamak rice" by CS Reddy, published in Rice & Pesticides: News & Updates Around the World, October 04, 2013, was reproduced in Asian Agri-History journal Volume 18, No. 1 in 2014. This article highlights information on Kalanamak published by the Foundation.
- 5. Krushak Ashram, a "cottage" for educated farmers, has been set up at Padali (Distt. Satara, Maharashtra) by Srirang

Supnekar, a progressive farmer, with the aim of getting farmers and farm scientists acquainted with agri-heritage of India so that the wisdom of our farmer-ancestors is integrated with modern farming practices. Focus is on ever-sustainable agriculture. YL Nene inaugurated the Krushak Ashram on 7 May 2014 in Pune and emphasized the need for deeper study of various texts on Vrikshayurveda and innovate practices to merge them with current practices. The "cottage" displays wall-paper size permanent posters, 53 each in English and Marathi. Contents are all based on AAHF's classics published since 1996 (see photo below).

- 6. **SN Nigam** visited Siliguri on 31 May 2014 and discussed with **Vijay S Parmar**, Co-Chair of the AAHF West Bengal Chapter various matters related to AAHF including opportunities to raise funds from the tea industry.
- 7. YL Nene was interviewed by Rambabu, Journalist, Sakshi daily,

Hyderabad in May 2014. Following the publication of the interview in *Sakshi* on 9 October 2014, many people contacted and/or visited AAHF Office, appreciated AAHF activities, and purchased AAHF publications.

- 8. The National Conference on Innovation in Traditional Practices for Cultivation of Fruit, Vegetable, and Plantation Crops was held on 11-12 December 2014 in Goa. The Conference was organized by AAHF and its Chapters – Rajasthan, Uttarakhand, and West Bengal, in collaboration with ICAR Research Complex for Goa and Association for Coastal Agricultural Research (ACAR) and was sponsored by ICAR, New Delhi. The Conference served as a platform for exchange of innovative environment-friendly and resource-conserving technologies to promote sustainable agriculture. On this occasion, K Salai Muthu (Administrator and Finance Officer, AAHF) and SK Khandelwal (Secretary, Rajasthan Chapter of AAHF) were honored with the Trustees Medal for their dedicated services rendered to the Foundation.
- 9. A Meeting of AAHF Trustees was held on 12 December 2014 in Goa. SN Nigam, YL Nene, MC Saxena, BL Agrawal, and Gajendra Singh attended.
- 10. **SL Choudhary,** Honorary Secretary, AAHF, visited Siliguri and Darjeeling in West Bengal from 2 to 5 March 2014 to layout experiments on "Effect of smoke fumigation on tea bushes" in tea gardens of PC Mittal group, Longview Tea Estate, Tukvar Tea Estate, and Nagrifarm Tea Estate. The fumigation experiments were successful in containing insect pest damage

to tea bushes. The practice of fumigation is gaining acceptance among the tea estates. At the invitation of farmers of Jind (Haryana), SL Choudhary demonstrated from 25 to 27 March 2014 the method of preparation of Kunapajala. He also delivered a keynote lecture in a Seminar on Goushalayein Aatmanibhar Ki Aur organized on 12 October 2014 by Shri Hadoti Go-Seva Sansthan, Kota, Rajasthan. He visited Goa and Hyderabad in October and November 2014 to discuss logistics and program of the National Conference on Innovation in Traditional Practices for Cultivation of Fruit, Vegetable, and Plantation Crops. He was Convenor, Organizing Committee of the Conference.

11. The 3rd World Congress on Agroforestry, co-hosted by ICAR, World Agro-forestry Centre, and the Indian Society of Agro-forestry, was held in February 2014 in New Delhi, India. In his inaugural speech, the President of India, Shri Pranab Mukherjee highly appreciated ancient scholar Surapala and his treatise on Vrikshayurveda, 'The Science of Plant Life'. He quoted from "Surapala's Vrikshayurveda" (Asian Agri-History Bulletin No. 1) published by AAHF in 1996. This bulletin includes the Sanskrit manuscript, English translation, and commentaries by experts. AAHF has also published the bulletin in Marathi and Hindi.

12. The website of the Foundation www. asianagrihistory.org is updated regularly. A large number of persons from all over the world contact AAHF each year seeking information on agricultural heritage of Asia.

- 13. During 2014, the following awards were conferred:
- Sipani Krishi Anusandhan Farm Award: Awarded to paper entitled "Indigenous knowledge of ethno-medicinal plants used by rural people in health care practices in Uttarakhand" authored by Tara Negi and Dhriti Solanki (Asian Agri-History 18(4):357-368). The Award carries a cash prize of ₹5000. In addition, each author receives a certificate
- Dr KL Mehra Memorial Award: Awarded to paper entitled "Coconut - history, uses, and folklore" authored by SC Ahuja, Siddharth Ahuja, and Uma Ahuja (Asian Agri-History 18(3):221-248). The Award carries a cash prize of ₹5000. In addition, each author receives a certificate.
- The Falvey Award: Awarded to paper entitled "The bovine hide industry in Thailand" by Pakapun Skunmun (Asian Agri-History 18(2):153–166). The Award consists of a cash prize of ₹10000 and a certificate to the author.

14. All Honorary Advisors, Honorary Editors, members of International Advisory Board and others, helped the Foundation, as and when needed, in fulfilling its mission and objectives. 15. The 2013–14 accounts were audited by the auditors Messrs. ND Karwa & Co., Hyderabad and submitted to the tax authorities in time.

- On behalf of the Chapter, VS Parmar, Co-Chairman congratulated both YL Nene on his retirement and SN Nigam for taking over as the Chairman of AAHF. SN Nigam interacted with Chapter members on 31 May 2014 at Siliguri on his visit to Kishangunj.
- The results of several experiments carried out by different tea gardens were shared by the planters at various meetings held during the year. The experiment on smoke fumigation suggested by YL Nene was carried out in March 2014 at the Nagrifarm Tea Estate, Tukvar Tea Estate, and Longview Tea Estate in Darjeeling and Samsing Tea Estate and Bamandanga Tea Estate

- in Dooara under the guidance and in the presence of SL Choudhary. The results have been very encouraging and there was good control of all insect pests namely, Heliopeltis, thrips, and greenfly.
- The write-up by the Greenpeace Organization, 'Hope Brewing' A Case Study of Bamandanga and Tondu Tea Estates – a success story of conversion of two large tea gardens to organic, for the first time, in recent years based on the traditional practices under the guidance of SL Choudhary is a great
- honor. A copy has been sent to the AAHF Headquarters as a souvenir; it makes very interesting reading.
- A day-long Meeting was held with the Scientists of the Darjeeling Tea Research and Development Centre (DTRDC), Kureseong, Darjeeling at the DTRDC Building. It was attended by SL Choudhary, VS Parmar, DTRDC Project Director, Tea Board of India, Mahipal Singh and his entire team of Scientists. Other Committee members from the Chapter were also present.

Sipani Krishi Anusandhan Farm Award 2014

The Asian Agri-History Foundation (AAHF) announces the Sipani Krishi Anusandhan Farm Award 2014 for the **Best Paper** in Asian Agri-History.

The paper entitled "Indigenous knowledge of ethno-medicinal plants used by rural people in health care practices in Uttarakhand" authored by Tara Negi and Dhriti Solanki (Asian Agri-History 18(4):357–368) has been selected by panels of judges and trustees as the Best Paper for the Award 2014. The Award consists of a cash prize of ₹5000 (which will be split equally between the authors) and a certificate to each author. The Award has been possible through a donation by Sipani Krishi Anusandhan Farm, Mandsaur, Madhya Pradesh, India. Papers authored by trustees, editors, and advisors of AAHF were not considered.
